Louisiana Family Forum (LFF) believes elected officials should support policies and programs that protect and promote families and traditional values in Louisiana. To accomplish this goal, LFF educates voters about specific legislation and voting records. Legislators scoring 100% are recognized as Outstanding Family Advocates.

LFF utilizes the official voting records of the Louisiana Legislature. In the House, members are allowed to change their votes in the Official Record. In the Senate, members are not allowed to change their votes. However, "On a debatable question each member shall be allowed to explain his/her vote in writing only, and this explanation shall be incorporated in the Journal if requested." (Senate Rule 12.1 B)

Legislators must be present and voting at least 50% of the time to be eligible for an Outstanding Family Advocate or Family Advocate Award. LFF only grades floor votes, not committee votes.

## Louisiana Senate 2014 Legislative Session

### 1. MEDICAID EXPANSION

SB 355 – Mills (R-New Iberia) [Nevers Amendment] Expansion of Medicaid consistent with implementing Obamacare.

Yes(x) = 15 No(✓) = 22 Absent(A) = 2

Status: Failed Senate Final Passage

### 2. CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMITS

HB 1066 – Thompson (R-Bossier City) [Final Passage] Provides for federal criminal history checks prior to the issuance of concealed handgun permits.

Yes(✓) = 31 No(x) = 5 Absent(A) = 3

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 3. STUDENT TUITION ORGANIZATIONS

HB 780 – Talbot (R-River Ridge) [Final Passage] Gives priority to Voucher Program students in Student Tuition Organizations.

Yes(✓) = 31 No(x) = 6 Absent(A) = 2

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 4. REAL ID

HB 907 – St. Germain (D-Plaquemine) [Final Passage] Creates the intrusive "Real ID" National ID card in Louisiana.

Yes(x) = 21 No(✓) = 16 Absent(A) = 2

Status: Vetoes by the Governor

### 5. PROHIBITS ABORTION PROVIDERS IN CLASSROOMS

HB 305 – Hoffmann (R-W. Monroe) [Final Passage] Prohibits abortion providers from making presentations or distributing materials in public schools.

Yes(✓) = 31 No(x) = 5 Absent(A) = 3

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 6. ABORTION INFORMED CONSENT

HB 1262 – Ivey (R-Baton Rouge) [Final Passage] Provides for the distribution of information on psychological impacts, illegal coercion, abuse, and human trafficking to women and girls prior to abortion.

Yes(✓) = 30 No(x) = 4 Absent(A) = 5

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 7. REQUIRES ABORTIONISTS HAVE ADMITTING PRIVILEGES

HB 388 – Jackson (D- Monroe) [Final Passage] Abortion facility regulations including requirement that abortionists have hospital admitting privileges.

Yes(✓) = 34 No(x) = 3 Absent(A) = 2

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 8. REPEAL OF BALANCED TREATMENT ACT

SB 70 – Claitor (R- Baton Rouge) [Final Passage] Would repeal Louisiana's law and statement of public policy calling for balanced treatment of origin science in public school classes.

Yes(x) = 5 No(✓) = 32 Absent(A) = 2

Status: Failed Senate Final Passage

### 9. PARENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS IN EDUCATION

SB 312 – Crowe (R- Slidell) [Final Passage] Provides important guidance to the parents and teachers of public school children.

### 1. REQUIRES ABORTIONISTS HAVE ADMITTING PRIVILEGES

HB 388 – Jackson (D- Monroe) [Final Passage] Abortion facility regulations including requirement that abortionists have hospital admitting privileges.

Yes(✓) = 85 No(x) = 6 Absent(A) = 14

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 2. SECOND AMENDMENT RIGHTS IN RESTAURANTS

HB 72 – Lopinto (R-Metairie) [Final Passage] Allows persons with concealed handgun permits and law enforcement to carry weapons in alcoholic beverage establishments.

Yes(✓) = 80 No(x) = 19 Absent(A) = 6

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 3. STUDENT TUITION ORGANIZATIONS

HB 780 – Talbot (R-River Ridge) [Final Passage] Gives priority to Voucher Program students in Student Tuition Organizations.

Yes(✓) = 55 No(x) = 38 Absent(A) = 12

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 4. PROHIBITS ABORTION PROVIDERS IN CLASSROOMS

HB 305 – Hoffmann (R-W. Monroe) [Final Passage] Prohibits abortion providers from making presentations or distributing materials in public schools.

Yes(✓) = 91 No(x) = 6 Absent(A) = 8

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 5. PARENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS IN EDUCATION

SB 312 – Crowe (R- Pearl River) [Final Passage] Provides important guidance to the parents and teachers of public school children.

Yes(✓) = 97 No(x) = 0 Absent(A) = 7

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 6. REAL ID

HB 907 – St. Germain (D-Plaquemine) [Final Passage] Creates the intrusive "Real ID" National ID card in Louisiana.

Yes(x) = 77 No(✓) = 24 Absent(A) = 4

Status: Vetoed by the Governor

### 7. GOVERNMENT WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION ACT

HB 1269 – Henry (R-Metairie) [Final Passage] Provides protection for public employees and contractors who report acts of alleged impropriety.

Yes(✓) = 91 No(x) = 0 Absent(A) = 14

Status: Signed by the Governor

### 8. SEX SURVEYS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

HB 393 – Smith (D-Baton Rouge) [Final Passage] Authorizes State Department of Education to survey students on their sexual practices.

Yes(x) = 36 No(✓) = 57 Absent(A) = 11

Status: Failed House Final Passage

### 9. REPEAL OF LOUISIANA CRIMES AGAINST NATURE STATUTE

HB 12 – Smith (D- Baton Rouge) [Final Passage] Repeals Louisiana's law prohibiting private and public acts of sodomy.

Yes(x) = 27 No(✓) = 67 Absent(A) = 11

Status: Failed House Final Passage

### 10. ALCOHOL IN ICE CREAM

HB 471 – Hunter (D- Monroe) [Final Passage] Authorizes the sale of ice cream containing wine in the state of Louisiana.

Yes(x) = 43 No(✓) = 47 Absent(A) = 14

Status: Failed House Final Passage
