Bill / Author	Result	Description
✓ HB 273 - HOFFMANN	Signed By Gov.	Post-abortion respectful treatment of fetal remains
✓ HB 891 - HOFFMANN	Signed By Gov.	Entities which perform abortions in La. prohibited from receiving public funding
✓ HB 287 - EDMONDS	Signed By Gov.	Strengthens LA law dealing with abortion based on genetic abnormality
✓ HB 449 - EDMONDS	Signed By Gov.	Incorporates adoption information as part of the Woman's Right to Know
✓ SB 181 - MILKOVICH	Signed By Gov.	Prohibits abortions after 15-weeks gestation. Enforcement predicated on success of court challenge to similar Mississippi law
✓ SB 534 - MILKOVICH	Signed By Gov.	Creates crime of coerced abortion
✓ SB 325 - MILKOVICH	Signed By Gov.	Additional reasons to suspend or revoke abortion facility license
✓ HCR 71 - EDMONDS	Passed	Requests the attorney general to file an amicus brief in federal court to support Mississippi's litigation to ban elective abortions after fifteen-weeks' gestation
✓ SB 250 - MIZELL	Signed By Gov.	Requires that parents of public school students be provided with information regarding the public health risk associated with pornography and access to information on prevention of addiction. Pornography use among children has been declared a public health risk in Louisiana by the legislature
✓ HB 830 - STOKES	Signed By Gov.	Requires age & work status verification to prevent human trafficking at sexually oriented businesses
✓ HB 237 - LEOPOLD	Signed By Gov.	Increases penalties for production of child pornography
✓ HB 312 - ABRAHAM	Signed By Gov.	No film tax credits for pornographic or obscene films
✓ SB 391 - MIZELL	Signed By Gov.	Internet filtering of government computers
✓ SB 335 - MIZELL	Signed By Gov.	Increases fines for purchasing commercial sex and makes options and requirements for attending programs to educate and inform about the harms, exploitation and negative effects of prostitution
✓ SB 166 - THOMPSON	Signed By Gov.	Post human trafficking hotline information at private use airports and bus terminals
✓ HB 488 - AMEDEE	Signed By Gov.	Adds crime of female genital mutilation to the list of crimes against a child
✓ SB 364 - WARD	Signed By Gov.	Free speech on college campuses
✓ HB 625 - EDMONDS	Signed By Gov.	Allows for maternity leave for teachers who adopt a child
✓ SB 224 - BARROW	Signed By Gov.	Promotes "In God we Trust" in public schools
✓ SB 512 - GATTI	Signed By Gov.	School employees may respectfully affirm students as they pray in school
✓ HB 650 - FOIL	Signed By Gov.	Allows 529 college savings in which earnings on the savings are not taxable to be used to pay tuition at any elementary or secondary public, private, or religious school
✓ SB 402 - RISER	Signed By Gov.	Church Safety Act - allows for volunteer security guard with a concealed carry permit to carry weapons in church
✓ SB 129 - GATTI	Signed By Gov.	Allows a person remain in foster care until high school completed or reaches the age 21
✓ HB 110 - HORTON	Signed By Gov.	Provides for hearing with respect to the placement of a child in the custody of DCFS. Currently DCFS has sole authority over placement
✓ SB 243 - MORRELL	Signed By Gov.	Constitutional amendment to require unanimous jury verdicts in state felony trials

<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 184 - MARTINY	Signed By Gov.	Video poker: lower fuel sales requirements for truck stop casinos in business at least for 10 yrs. Most of our objections in original bill were neutralized
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> HB 553 – BARRAS	Bill Failed	Locks the state into a contract with Harrah’s to operate the land based casino in New Orleans for another 30 years, Allows Harrah’s unlimited restaurants, and allows for building a new hotel
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 417 - B. WHITE	Bill Failed	Referendum on moving a riverboat to Tangipahoa Parish

<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 383 - T. CARTER	Bill Failed	“Law Enforcement Ammunition Tracking Act” would set up a central computerized system to track ammunition purchases
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> HB 274 - JORDAN	Bill Failed	Legalizes the sale and use of marijuana for recreational purposes
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 98 - MORRELL	Bill Failed	Redefinition of marriage
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 463 - PETERSON	Bill Failed	Redefinition of marriage. Will become a study resolution
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 219 - T. CARTER	Bill Failed	Non-discrimination in employment based on sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 228 - MORRELL	Bill Failed	Non-discrimination in public schools based on gender identity and sexual orientation. Would create confusion about separation of sexes for sports, bathrooms, and dressing areas
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> HCR 27 - P.SMITH	Passed	Task Force to study problems faced by incarcerated women. Transgender language amended out of the resolution
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 51 - MORRELL HB 162 - T. LANDRY	Bill Failed	Eliminates the death penalty
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 13 - WARD Special Session	Signed By Gov.	Requires the commissioner of administration to establish and maintain a fiscal transparency website to post data and reports of state expenditures, contracts, incentive expenditures, revenues, and other financial matters
<span style="color: green; font-size: 2em;">✓</span> SB 11 - MORRELL Special Session	Bill Failed	Limits annual expenditures on certain tax credit and rebate programs and terminates the programs in 2025. Would harm Student Tuition Organization tax credit program
<span style="color: red; font-size: 2em;">✗</span> HB 484 - TALBOT	Signed By Gov.	Opens the door to internet gambling in La. by allowing gambling on virtual sports competition such as fantasy football
<span style="color: red; font-size: 2em;">✗</span> SB 316 - JOHNS	Signed By Gov.	Allows riverboats to establish facilities on land within 1200 ft. of current berth and removes maximum amount of space that can be used for gaming. Establishes maximum “gaming positions” at 2,365
<span style="color: red; font-size: 2em;">✗</span> SB 525 - LAFLEUR	Signed By Gov.	De-regulation: Changes race track casino gambling capacity. Currently based on size. Proposed law bases on max number of machines - 1,632 machines
<span style="color: red; font-size: 2em;">✗</span> HB 500 - ABRAMSON	Bill Failed	Constitutional amendment to allow a limited constitutional convention for fiscal matters
<span style="color: red; font-size: 2em;">✗</span> HB 510 - BARRAS	Bill Failed	“Louisiana Checkbook.” More information available to the public on state expenditures
