Louisiana House of Representatives Legislative Regular Session

1. FAIRNESS IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

SB 44 – Mizell – Prohibits male students from participating on women's teams. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 72 No(X) = 21 Absent(A) = 12

Status: Became law without Governor's signature.

2. ADOPTION BREACH OF CONFIDENTIALITY

HB 450 – C. Owen – Disclosure of birth parent information to adoptees even when birth parent desires confidentiality.

LFF Opposed.

Yes(X) = 76 No(✓) = 21 Absent(A) = 7

Status: Signed by the Governor - ACT 470.

3. ABORTION TRIGGER LAW – RAPE AND INCEST EXCEPTIONS

SB 342 – Jackson – Vote on House amendment which includes rape and incest exceptions to Louisiana's ban on abortion.

LFF Supported SB 342 / Opposed Amendment.

Yes(X) = 37 No(✓) = 62 Absent(A) = 6

Status: Signed by the Governor - ACT 545.

4. MAIL-ORDER ABORTION BAN

SB 388 – Hewitt – Prohibits sale or use of dangerous mail-order chemical abortion drugs. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 72 No(X) = 24 Absent(A) = 9

Status: Signed by the Governor - ACT 548.

5. NO MARIJUANA SMOKING IN VEHICLE

HB 234 – Schlegel – No smoking or vaping marijuana or its chemical derivative in a vehicle while operating or as a passenger.

LFF Supported.

Yes(✓) = 67 No(X) = 30 Absent(A) = 7

Status: Signed by the Governor - ACT 478.

6. SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND TRANSGENDERISM IN HOUSING LAW

HB 303 – Freeman – Special protections based on legally undefined Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity. **LFF Opposed.**

Yes(X) = 35 No(✓) = 48 Absent(A) = 22

Status: Failed House Final Passage.

7. NO SEXUAL POLITICS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

HB 837 – Horton – School personnel cannot discuss sexual orientation or gender identity with students. Vote to bring bill to House floor for debate. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 55 No(X) = 39 Absent(A) = 11

Status: Bill stalled on House Floor.

8. PROTECTING CHILDREN ON THE INTERNET

HB 142 – Schlegel – Allows parents to sue pornographic websites for age verification violations. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 96 No(X) = 1 Absent(A) = 8

Status: Signed by the Governor - ACT 440.

9. HEALTHCARE FREEDOM

HB 117 – Echols – Allows healthcare professionals to prescribe and dispense drugs for off-label use. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 74 No(X) = 20 Absent(A) = 11

Status: Senate failed to adopt conference committee report.

10. ELECTION INTEGRITY

HB 35 – Farnum – Clean-up of voter registration rolls identifying outdated addresses. **LFF Supported.**

Yes(✓) = 69 No(X) = 28 Absent(A) = 8

Status: Vetoed by the Governor.

11. SCHOOL CHOICE
