1. RELIGIOUS FREEDOM AMENDMENT

SB 63 – Mizell – Freedom of Assembly is a fundamental right deserving the utmost protection from governmental interference like experienced in COVID crisis. **LFF Supported.**

Status: **Constitutional Amendment; on ballot 10/23.**

2. STOP HARMING CHILDREN ACT

HB 648 – Firment – Prohibits harmful gender manipulating drugs and procedures for minors. **LFF Supported Vote to Override Veto.**

Status: **Veto Overridden - ACT 466.**

3. STOP INDOCTRINATING CHILDREN WITH PRONOUNS

HB 81 – Crews – School personnel must use student pronouns consistent with biological sex. **LFF Supported.**

Status: **Vetoed by the Governor; Override failed in House.**

4. NO SEXUAL POLITICS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

HB 466 – Horton – School personnel prohibited from talking with students about sexual orientation and gender identity. **LFF Supported.**

Yes (✓) = 29 No (X) = 9 Absent (A) = 1

Status: **Vetoed by the Governor - Override failed in House.**

5. PROTECT CHILDREN IN PUBLIC LIBRARIES

SB 7 – Cloud – Requires that libraries limit children's access to sexually explicit material. **LFF Supported.**

Status: **Signed by the Governor - ACT 436.**

6. LOUISIANA ELECTION INTEGRITY

HB 311 – Miguez – Prohibits private or foreign government funding for Louisiana election related expenses. **LFF Supported.**

Status: **Constitutional Amendment - On ballot 10/23.**

7. ELECTION INTEGRITY

HB 260 – Beaulieu – Ensures state control over Louisiana elections without federal interference. **LFF Supported.**

Yes (✓) = 27 No (X) = 9 Absent (A) = 3

Status: **Vetoed by the Governor.**

8. VACCINE MANDATES

HB 399 – Edmonston – Disclosure of exemption information for student vaccines. **LFF Supported.**

Yes (✓) = 23 No (X) = 16 Absent (A) = 0

Status: **Vetoed by the Governor - Override failed in Senate (requires 2/3 vote).**

9. VACCINE DISTRIBUTION

HB 471 – Freiberg – Reduces professional requirements for those administering vaccines in pharmacies. **LFF Opposed.**

Yes (X) = 23 No (✓) = 14 Absent (A) = 2

Status: **Conference Committee Report rejected in House.**

10. LIFE AFFIRMING VITAL RECORDS

HB 457 – Crews – Certificate of non-viable birth for babies deceased in utero. **LFF Supported.**

Yes (✓) = 34 No (X) = 2 Absent (A) = 3

Status: **Signed by the Governor - Act 353.**

11. FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

SCR 3 – Cortez – Increased the Louisiana Constitutionally determined expenditure limit. **LFF Opposed.**

We believe excess dollar above that cap should be: 1) Returned to their rightful owners - taxpayers; 2) Allowed to be declared "surplus" and then used for constitutionally directed imperatives; 3) used to retire debt and make state pensions solvent; 4) Deposited in the Rainy Day Fund.

Louisiana Family Forum (LFF) believes elected officials should support policies and programs that protect and promote families and traditional values in Louisiana. To accomplish this goal, LFF educates voters about specific legislation and voting records. Legislators scoring 100% are recognized as Outstanding Family Advocates.

LFF utilizes the official voting records of the Louisiana Legislature. In the House, members are allowed to change their votes in the Official Record. In the Senate, members are not allowed to change their votes. However, "On a debatable question each member shall be allowed to explain his/her vote in writing only, and this explanation shall be incorporated in the Journal if requested." (Senate Rule 12.1 B)

Legislators must be present and voting at least 50% of the time to receive a score or be eligible for an Outstanding Family Advocate or Family Advocate Award. LFF only grades floor votes, not committee votes. Absences are not counted against legislators in calculating scores.
